3. COMPOSITION/INFORMATION ON INGREDIENTS

This product contains the following components and mixture of the following substances with non-hazardous additions.

Reagent: Solid

Contains firefly Luciferin (CAS #: 2591-17-5), Coenzyme A (CAS #: 55672-92-9), adenosine triphosphate (CAS #: 149022-20-8)

Assay Buffer: 20 mL / 50 mL / 100 mL Liquid

Contains <0.6% 2-mercaptoethanol (CAS #: 60-24-2), <0.6% Triton X-100 (CAS #: 9002-93-1) and 15% glycerol (CAS #: 56-81-5)

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye: Eye irritation. Flush immediately with large amounts of water for at least 15 minutes. Eyelids should be held away from the eyeball to ensure thorough rinsing. Get immediate medical attention.

Skin: Itching or burning of the skin. Immediately flush the skin with plenty of water while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Get immediate medical attention. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

Inhalation: Remove exposed person from source of exposure to fresh air. If not breathing, clear airway and start cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). Avoid mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.

Ingestion: Get immediate medical attention. Do not induce vomiting unless directed by medical personnel.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: water spray, carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder or appropriate foam.

Special firefighting procedures: wear self-contained breathing apparatus and protective clothing to prevent contact with skin and eyes.

Unusual fire and explosion hazards: emits toxic fumes under fire conditions.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Keep unnecessary people away; isolate hazard area and deny entry. Small spills: Take up with sand or other noncombustible absorbent material and place into containers for later disposal. Large spills: Dike far ahead of liquid

spill for later disposal. Do not flush to sewer or waterways. Prevent release to the environment if possible.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Keep receptacles tightly sealed and store according to the instructions in the assay protocol.

8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS/PERSONAL PROTECTION

Follow standard laboratory safety procedures, including wearing chemical safety goggles, face shield, gloves, NIOSH approved respiratory protection and protective clothing. Wash and dry hands.

10. STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

11. TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

The toxicological effects of this product have not been thoroughly studied. We recommend handling all chemicals with caution.

Triton X-100 - Oral LC50 rat: 1,800 mg/kg; Inhalation LC50: no data available; Dermal LD50 rabbit: 8,000 mg/kg. Other information on acute toxicity: no data available.

Adenosine 5'-triphosphate - Oral: no data available; Inhalation: no data available; Dermal: no data available. Other information on acute toxicity: no data available.

β -Mercaptoethanol - Oral rat LD50: 98 mg/kg; Inhalation rat 4h: 2 mg/L; Dermal rabbit: 112 mg/kg. Other information on acute toxicity: irritating to the skin, eyes.
